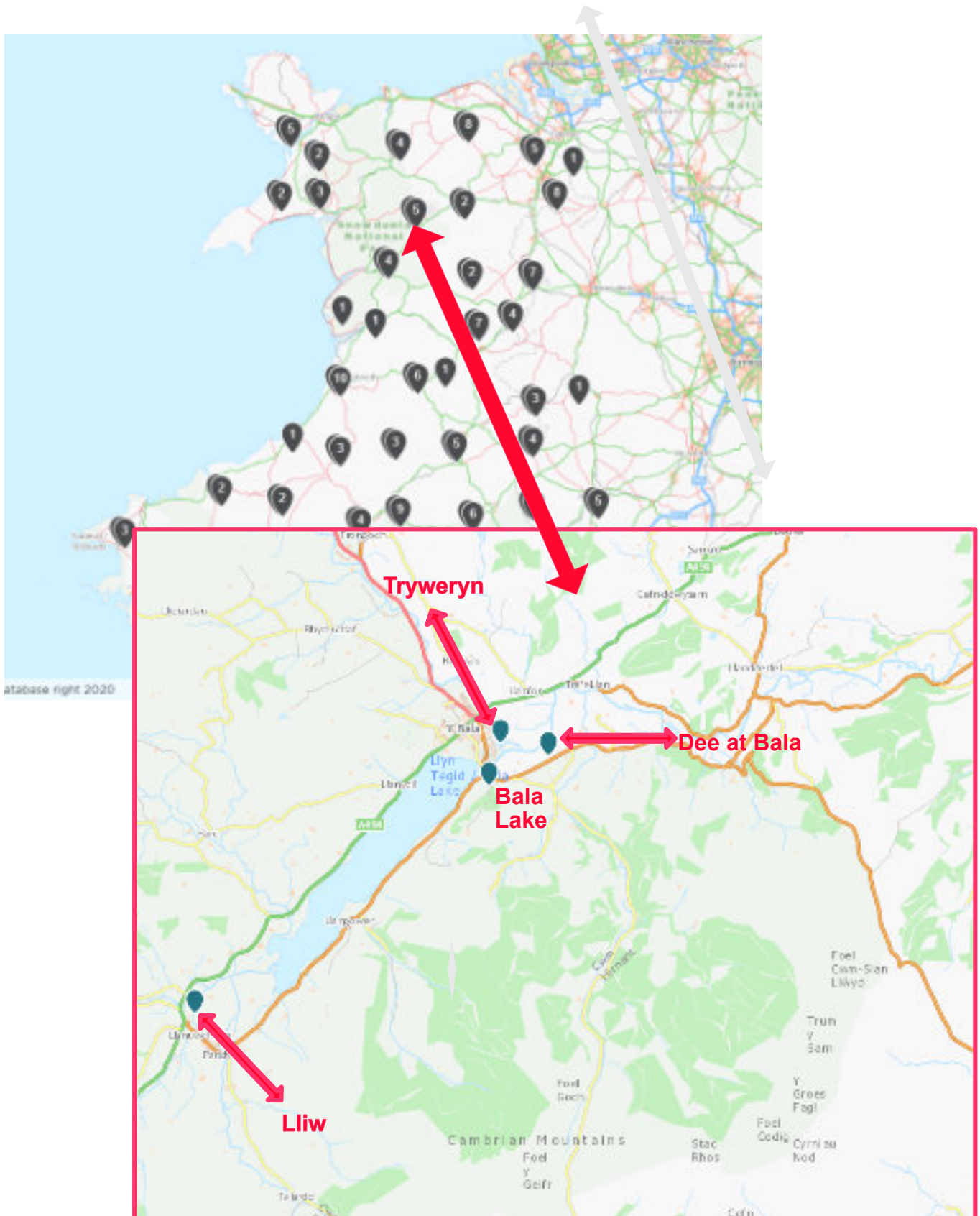


NRW gauges for river levels in Wales.



Click on the link below to get to NRW river levels page. When the map, top, has loaded zoom in by clicking or using the + symbol on the map. Choose the icon with 5 on it - sometimes 6!- and get to the bottom picture of the lake. Put the cursor/pointer on an icon to see the level, or click it.

Tryweryn - 0.8m and over is good water for fishing.

Lliw - 1.0M is good for fly and up to about 1.3M for anything else. Above this it starts getting into the field.

Bala Lake - Normal level is about 1.3-1.6M. At 2.0M water is covering the parking foreshore and above 2.5M there is no foreshore and fishing from the bank is difficult as water is in the tree line.

Dee - 0.3M-0.35M (or less) is ideal for fly. Up to about 0.45 is good for anything else and salmon anglers would probably want more. After 0.6M it becomes too high.
